
LIFEGUARD AWARD

Eastwood Week of Languages



It is estimated that over 6,000 languages are spoken across the world today and the Eastwood Week of Languages was an opportunity to raise awareness of our linguistic diversity and learn more about different languages and cultures. Pupils were invited to participate in a range of class and group activities, ranging from general knowledge of European countries to learning greetings and cultural information from different countries.

POST 16 PROVIDERS ASSEMBLIES
