The Eastwood Academy – Teaching

Why teach?

More of the best graduates and professionals are training to teach. That's because there are more great reasons to pursue a career in teaching than ever before. You can benefit from financial support during your training, and once you've qualified you can enjoy enviable job security and a generous pension. Plus you get the chance to inspire young people and use your skills to give something back – making sure every pupil gets the same access to a quality education and the opportunity to succeed. School led training

On a school-led training course, you'll get the chance to learn on the job in at least two schools, learning from experienced colleagues and putting your new skills into practice from day one. School-led courses are referred to as the SCITT (school-centred initial teacher training) programme.

University led training

Universities and colleges offer teacher training courses for both graduates and undergraduates.

University-led courses run full-time over one year or part-time over two years. Your training will include spending time at your university or college, working with other trainees and being taught by university colleagues.

You'll also spend plenty of time in your placement schools – a minimum of 24 weeks

Suggested Questions to Ask Employers

- What kinds of skills and experience do you look for in the employees you hire?
- What are the characteristics of your most successful employees?
- Are graduate degrees important to advancing within your organisation?
- Which courses or experiences do you suggest to be a successful candidate?
- What can a typical employee hired in your division expect to be doing in 2, 5 or 10 years after hiring?
- Are there opportunities for on-going training within your organisation?
- What made you choose this company and why do you stay?
- How long have you been with the company?
- What's the one thing that most surprised you about this company?
- What are the best parts of your job?
- What are the low points of your job; are there any?

Suggested Questions to 6th form / FE Colleges

- Explain the difference between NVQ / BTEC / A Levels
- Can we study BTECs / A Levels at the same time?
- Do you run apprenticeship courses?
- Are courses full or part time?
- Will I need to buy equipment or books?
- Is there any work experience involved in the course?
- Will I receive any careers advice?
- How much homework will I be expected to complete?
- How are we assessed?
- Is our attendance monitored?
- Is there any one-to-one mentoring?
- Are there opportunities to do other, enrichment type activities like trips, Duke of Edinburgh, sports teams?

Apprenticeships

The world is changing fast, and to get ahead you need up-to-date skills. But you don't need to sit in a classroom all day to get them – there are other ways of learning that could suit you.

An apprenticeship is a real job with training, so you can earn while you learn and get recognised qualifications as you go.

You can apply for an apprenticeship if:

- you live in England
- you're 16 or over
- you're not in full-time education

Apprenticeships take between 1 and 4 years to complete. They cover 1,200 job roles in a range of industries, from engineering to financial advice, veterinary nursing to accountancy.

If you're interested in an apprenticeship but you don't yet have the skills and experience to get onto one, a traineeship could be for you. A traineeship is a placement that will give you the chance to get some work experience and improve your skills. It can last anything from 6 weeks to 6 months

Progress in your career: surveys show that employers recognise and value apprenticeships, so with hard work you could rise through the ranks quickly.

Achieve sought-after qualifications: apprenticeships are the gold standard for work-based learning.

Learn job-specific skills: learn from knowledgeable tutors and work alongside experienced staff to gain in-demand skills.

Earn a salary: the average wage for an apprentice is £170 per week.
