At the time of writing, I am slightly incredulous that we have reached the half-way point in the academic year....

In terms of the curriculum, the development of CREATE is moving apace and will form part of a wider review of the structure of Key Stage 3 and 4, which I will update parents and pupils on in the second half of the Spring Term.

In terms of attendance, currently this is 93.3~% vs. a national average of 91.0% (+2.3%) and persistent absence is 18.2% vs. a national average of 28.0% (-9.8%).

In recognition of the above, the Academy received a commendation from Fisher Family Trust (FFT) for recording an attendance level in the top 25% of similar schools nationally.

In terms of site/estate work, I am pleased to confirm that the Academy will shortly be embarking on an energy efficient infrastructural project involving the installation of solar panels, funded in part, by a one-off ring-fenced capital grant of £42, 000 from the Government.

STUDENT LEADERSHIP TEAM

The Academy had over 100 applications, with 67 pupils applying for positions on the StLT. The next stage will involve applicants completing mock duty trials before feedback is sought from staff on pupils' suitability for the role.

Houchen was impressed by both the scale and scope of the ideas and the drive of the team in pushing their suggestions forward.

Pearl and Mr. S. Howard judging which speeches were the most effective.


The competition was fierce. Six pupils made it through, and they now have to enhance and improve their speeches

ended with pupils creating a social media post promoting apprenticeships. The winning design will be used for the EastwoodAcademyFutureReady Instagram account.




Extra-Curricular
